## CONNECTING WITH GOD

#### From Pastor Hahn



Let me ask you a question: What was your most memorable or most exciting birthday?

Was is the celebration of a round number birthday? The birthday when you actually did get the outrageous gift you asked for (maybe a pet or a car), although you were sure, it would not happen? Or was

it the birthday when you were totally surprised by friends and/or family with a surprise party? Maybe it was the birthday you were glad to celebrate after a serious life challenge, such as a major illness or a relationship crisis.

Most people, I believe, can name at least one such special birthday. Of course, there are more and more people who, in addition to their biological birthdays, celebrate their spiritual birthdays or their "rebirthday," i.e. the day when they were "born again" in the power of the Holy Spirit. But I digress.

Let me ask you another question: Why do we give birthday gifts? Among the variety of reasons people have for giving birthday gifts, the following are key: (1) to show appreciation for what the other means to us or has done for us; (2) searching for, buying or making the birthday gift for the other makes us feel good; (3) we know that the other will get a lot of delight or use from the gift.

The same reasons, I submit to you, apply when we give a birthday gift not to a person but an organization, such as our church family.

It just so happens that the Immanuel Church family is turning 225 this fall, and we will be celebrating both on September 17<sup>th</sup> and October 29<sup>th</sup>.

The congregation council believes birthday gifts to Immanuel are an appropriate way to mark this special milestone in our history. The council invites the members and friends to make "second-mile gifts" (gifts in addition to your weekly gifts) towards a goal of \$2,250 (I trust you get the number reference.)

One fun and meaningful way would be to give one dollar (\$1) for every year that you have been a part of the Immanuel church family. Or less or each year (say 50 cents), if one dollar per year is more than you could handle; or more per year if, like Lyn and I, you haven't been here that long or if you are especially grateful for your church family.

A lot of things have changed in those 225 years, but some things have remained the same: God's love and steadfastness, God's amazing grace, and God's unfailing presence. And that is good news!

#### DAS REFORMATIONSJUBILÄUM 2017 FEIERN

Jede Zeit entfaltet ihr eigenes Gedenken. Alle Gemeinschaften erzählen ihre Ursprungsgeschichten vor dem Hintergrund ihrer Gegenwart. Das gilt für jedes Jubiläum, auch für 2017.

Zwischen dem 16. und dem 21.
Jahrhundert liegen Welten. Amerika war damals gerade erst entdeckt, der Buchdruck erfunden. Heute sind Smart-phones allgegenwärtig, wir leben in einer globalisierten, multikulturellen und in Teilen säkularisierten Welt.

Von hier aus werfen wir den Blick auf das, was vor 500 Jahren mit der Frage nach Gott und dem Verhältnis des Menschen zu ihm begann. Denn diese Frage und die Antwort, die die Reformatoren darauf gegeben haben, veränderten damals den Glauben, die Kirche und die europäischen Gesellschaften.

# Celebrating the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation

Each historical epoch shapes its own memory.

Communities of any kind tell of their beginnings against the backdrop of the present. This is true for

all anniversaries, including the one celebrated this year.

The 16<sup>th</sup> and the 21<sup>st</sup> Century are worlds apart. Back then, America had just been discovered and the printing press invented. Today, smart phones are everywhere, and we live in a globalized, multi-cultural, and partially secularized world.

That is context from which we look at the events of 1517, which began with a man's search for a gracious God and his quest to be in relationship with that God. The question at the heart of this search and how the Reformers answered it transformed the Christian Faith, the Church, and the European societies.



GRACE, FAITH, SCRIPTURE

The world in which we live today has been shaped in significant ways by the Reformation. That is to be lifted up in the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations. At the same time, there is this reality: the key insights of the Reformation have not lost any of their power. They are still very much relevant.

The anniversary of the Reformation will be celebrated differently in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century compared to

anniversaries in previous centuries. The anniversary is not just a spiritual and ecclesial event, but has significance for all of Germany, for Europe, and the entire world. More at <a href="https://www.ekd.de">www.ekd.de</a>

The Building Committee is grateful to have a Pastor who is not afraid to lend a helping hand, wherever it is needed.



## **How Is The Parsonage Renovation Coming Along?**

The Building Committee started work on the Parsonage renovation after the 2016 congregational meeting authorized them to begin work. We spent weeks coordinating contractors and working on competitive proposals, thus saving the congregation from the cost of hiring a general contractor. With help from congregational members, we contacted Philadelphia Gas Works for a new natural gas service to the parsonage. The chimney needed repair and a liner was installed for the new heating system. The

old oil boiler and tank were removed and a new efficient gas boiler and hot water heater now heats the house.

We looked at items that needed to be done before winter set in. The old garage door was replaced and the concrete floor, which was in very poor shape, also needed to be poured before it got too cold. The walls and falling ceiling were removed and replaced. A garage painting with pizza party was held on July 1, 2017. (Photos on page 6.)

The parsonage has its unique architecture including many rooms, two-foot thick walls, and of course being such an old house, we found some unforeseen issues with termite damage in the basement which needed repair and treatment. A sewer drainpipe in the basement sprung a leak and needed to be replaced. The electrical service needed to be replaced and the house wiring was also replaced due to decaying insulation of the wiring in the upper floors. We also added smoke detectors to each bedroom for extra safety.

In late fall 2016, we coordinated with one of our contractors to replace the windows and doors. He installed 43 high efficiency windows and three exterior doors and storm doors. This really seals up the house and you can feel the difference on those cold and blustery days.

The committee took advantage of the Black Friday sales and rebates after Thanksgiving to purchase new appliances for the kitchen. The kitchen was remodeled with new cabinets, countertop and flooring. This started work on the interior of the house. All three bathrooms and the powder room were reconstructed with new showers, vanities, toilets and bathtub (Yes, the old heavy cast iron tub on the third floor was removed in one piece). Five interior doors had to be replaced and all the doors

were made operational.

Plastering and ceiling repairs
were done and on the third
floor a special flexible plaster
is used on the ceilings to
conform to the angled
ceilings from the roof.

New 30-year shingles were replaced on the roof and the roof decking (old cedar shingles were found underneath). The gutters and downspouts were replaced, directing water into the city's drainage system.

The landscape around the parsonage has changed. The five pine trees were removed which gives a better frontal view and will warm the house in the winter. The old oak tree on the side of the house needed to be cut down because it was rotten in the center and could have fallen on the parsonage.

We are also working on the porch roofs, giving them a good pitch and gutter system for good water runoff.

Our painting contractor has started on the interior painting. We are also installing carpets in two rooms and the hallway on the third floor. The electricians still need to install some lighting fixtures in the coming weeks.

The committee is still working on an air conditioning proposal and finishing the exterior walls.
