Neue EKD-Studie: Deutsche wollen Fluechtlingen weiter helfen

Mehrere bundesweite Umfragen haben im Auftrag der Evangelischen Kirchen in Deutschland (EKD) die positiven Erfahrungen und konkreten Sorgen erforscht, die die Bundesbuerger mit der Aufnahme von Fluechtlingen verbinden. Hier die wichtigsten Ergebnisse:

- 1. Die Bevölkerung im westlichen Bundesgebiet tendiert seit Februar 2016 eher zum Positiven. Im östlichen Bundesgebiet überwiegt die skeptische Stimmung deutlich.
- 2. Nach wie vor unterstreichen die allermeisten Befragten, dass Deutschland mit der Aufnahme von Flüchtlingen Menschen in existenzieller Not zur Seite steht.
- 3. Eine Mehrheit der Bevölkerung verbindet mit den in Deutschland angekommenen Geflüchteten auch die Chance, Bereicherndes für den eigenen Alltag zu entdecken.
- 4. Inzwischen haben knapp zwei Drittel der Bevölkerung schon eigene Erfahrungen im Kontakt zu Flüchtlingen gemacht. Bei den Befragten mit Kontakt übersteigt der Anteil der positiven Erfahrungen mit Geflüchteten die negativen um ein Mehrfaches.
- 5. Die Bereitschaft zum Engagement ist nach wie vor sehr hoch: Insgesamt können sich drei Viertel der Befragten die eine oder andere persönliche Unterstützung der Geflüchteten vorstellen.
- 6. Die große Mehrheit der Befragten (69 %) spricht sich auch im August 2016 dafür aus, dass sich die evangelische Kirche für die Aufnahme der Flüchtlinge einsetzen soll.

New Study by German Church: Germans want to help refugees

Several nation-wide research studies, commissioned by the Protestant Church in Germany (EKD), investigated the positive experiences and concrete concerns of German citizens in regards to welcoming and integrating refugees. Here are the most important results:

- 1. Since February 2016, attitudes of citizens in the western parts of Germany are becoming more and more positive. Citizens in the eastern parts are significantly more skeptical.
- 2. The great majority of survey participants are convinced that by welcoming refugees, Germany actively reaches out to people who are in grave danger and great need.
- 3. For the majority of German citizens, the newly arrived refugees provide opportunities to enrich their own lives and widen their own horizons.
- 4. By now, about two-thirds of the population has had personal contact with refugees. The great majority of those interviewed has had positive experiences and encounters with refugees; negative experiences are reported by a minority.
- 5. The survey reveals a high level of willingness of people to get personally involved. About 75% of respondents can see themselves committing to one type of refugee support or another.
- 6. The great majority (69%) of those surveyed in August of 2016 is in favor of the Protestant Church's advocacy on behalf of refugee acceptance and welcome.


COMING IN MARCH A NEW LOOK
