## **CONNECTING WITH GOD**

#### From Pastor Hahn

My dear Immanuel church family,

**Recently,** the Olympic Winter Games and the Super Bowl were broadcast on our televisions. Both events are the pinnacle of a lifetime of practice and training in the lives of their athletes.

Most of the competitors are primarily young people. A few continue competing in their thirties (and maybe early 40s). But those are the exceptions. In general, it is assumed that athletes stop training, stop competing, and move on to other things as they get to a certain age.

I am wondering: does the same principle apply to people of faith, to Christians, to the followers of Christ—to you and me? Do we stop growing in our faith? Do we stop learning? Do we stop getting closer to God? Do we stop investing a portion of our time in spiritual

growth?

A wise man, Lao Tse, once said: "Learning is like rowing against the current. If you stop rowing, you go backwards." And who wants to go backwards?

If recent studies and surveys are on the mark, a lot of people of

faith are biblically illiterate and poorly equipped for living a full and rewarding spiritual life. That does not have to be so!

Take on the challenge of six weeks of "spiritual spring training." It begins on Ash Wednesday (March 2) and continues through the season of Lent, the 40 Days before Easter (not counting Sundays).

**During this time,** we can train, learn, practice, and grow in the classical "spiritual disciplines" of Lent: You can:

(1) enrich your worship life with mid-week services

(2) deepen your prayer life by using the special prayer calendar

(3) grow in your devotional habits by using the daily devotional booklet

(4) widen your exposure to the wisdom of the Holy Bible by joining the "Christ in Our Home" online conversation group

(5) grow in your love of neighbor and in your generosity by either supporting the World Hunger relief emphasis or the LWR health kit emphasis

(6) practice a spiritual fast by cutting back on non-spiritual time and expenses (e.g., entertainment and fun-related ones) and donate the time and money saved to one of the other five disciplines.

I know there is that saying, "You can't teach an old dog new tricks," but you and I are neither old, nor are we dogs. We are the redeemed, loved, and empowered children of God, called to be God's hands and voices on earth.

As the proverb puts it: "We never stop learning." "Even on our deathbed," says researcher Petra Ritter, "are we able to learn the name of the nurse attending to us."

Welcome, then, to "Team Immanuel," to Spiritual Spring Training 2022. We have saved a spot on the team for you!



Lent may be a time of reflection, but it need not be one of inaction. You are invited to share your love with our neighbors around the world by getting your hands busy making Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief (LWR).

LWR Kits are specifically designed to help people coping with poverty, disaster, conflict and more. LWR Kits provide dignity and hope in the direct situations.

Kits may be dropped off at the Immanuel campus during Holy Week (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, and Easter Sunday).

If you would prefer to make a financial donation of \$15.00 per kit, please make a check payable to Immanuel Lutheran Church, with Lutheran World Relief on the memo line.

# INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT:

- ✓ ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- ✓ TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- ✓ ONE adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- ✓ ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging
- ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging



#### **HOW TO PACK YOUR PERSONAL CARE KIT:**

• Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.

# SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER:

- Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- All items should be new and in good condition
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.
