CONNECTING WITH GOD

From Pastor Hahn

My dear Immanuel church family,

"In Holy Baptism, our

gracious heavenly Father liberates us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ."

You have heard these words often—every time

when you participated in the baptism of a child or affirmed your own baptism (as we have been doing in our mini-series, "The Benefits of Baptism" in March).

We associate the above words with baptisms. But they are Easter words, too. (And, of course, Good Friday words.) "Sin" and "death" we know. They are part of life. But "resurrection"?

As Spring gets underway some people are tempted to point, as examples of resurrection, to budding trees or flowers that begin to poke their heads through the ground.

Author and theologian, Barbara Brown Taylor, says that would be a mistake. The re-awakening of nature every Spring is, well, natural, she says (and I paraphrase), while "resurrection" is not.

The entire awesomeness, mystery, and holiness the complete "otherness"—of Christ's resurrection from the dead on the first Easter is so unique. As the gateway to everlasting communion with God on the other side of the gate we know as "death" it is a once-in-History event.

Sure, Easter has become commodified and commercialized in our culture, and even some Christians have settled into shallow or perfunctory observations of this special festival.

I trust, however, that, with a little effort, everyone can get back in touch with the power and promise

of Easter: death, destruction, endings, loss --and all the emotions that go along with such experiences—will NOT have the last word.

> Newness, new beginnings, and hope—these are the operating principles of Easter. The victory is ours. Thanks be to God!



Bedford-Strohm über Nächstenliebe: **"Wer fromm ist, muss auch politisch sein"** Für den bayerischen evangelischen Landesbischof Heinrich Bedford-Strohm gehört politisches Engagement zur Christenpflicht.

"Wer fromm ist, muss auch politisch sein", sagte der ehemalige Ratsvorsitzende der Evangelischen Kirche in Deutschland (EKD), Heinrich Bedford-Strohm, dem Berliner "Tagesspiegel" (Dienstag). "Jesus hat gesagt: Du sollst Gott lieben und deinen Nächsten wie dich selbst." Christentum bedeute, "dass die Gottesliebe nie von der Nächstenliebe zu trennen ist".

Bedford-Strohm betonte, viele Aspekte menschlicher Not hätten auch politische Ursachen: "Diese anzugehen, gehört genauso zu unserem Auftrag, wie die Symptome zu bekämpfen."

Mit Blick auf die umstrittenen Aktionen der Klimabewegung "Letzte Generation" sagte der evangelische Theologe: "Wir brauchen diese kompetenten Aktivisten, die ein tolles Engagement zeigen, in der Politik; als Motoren der politischen Veränderung."

Er wünsche sich, "dass solche Leute in den Parteien aktiv sind und massiv darauf hinwirken, dass man kapiert, dass noch nicht ausreicht, was gegenwärtig passiert", sagte Bedford-Strohm, der auch Vorsitzender des Zentralausschusses des Ökumenischen Rats der Kirchen ist.





This is incredible gift helps us continue our mission to address hunger, meet needs, and inspire hope in our community of Northeast Philadelphia.

The cost of food is at an all-time high and we are noticing the need in our community growing. With the help of individuals such as yourself, this summer we served between 250-300 households and distributed more than 20,297 lbs. of food each week in our programs. We offered summer programs, such as, Let's Eat and our Outdoor Mini Pantry to ensure our community was receiving food while the kids were out of school. We have seen our programming respond to COVID changes by continuously pivoting to keep our guests and staff safe, while also providing our guests with choices around the food they receive for their family.

We continue to work towards the development of the new Northeast Services Hub in Oxford Circle, with an opening date to come soon! This will allow us to collaborate with other partner agencies to provide creative wrap-around services to the community along a vital neighborhood corridor.
