Provide general learning opportunities through educational forums, book clubs, classes, discussion groups, educational film, field trips, lending library, and other learning opportunities.

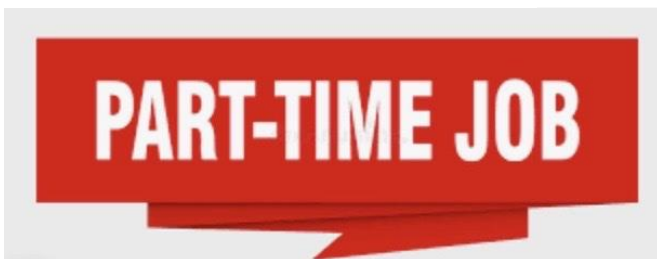
Socialization

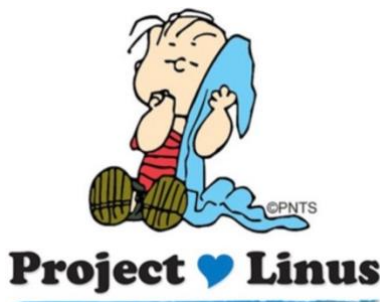


Dear Immanuel Church Members,
